WRONG DIAGNOSIS


God tells us in **Revelation 4:11** the He is worthy of glory, honor and power. We were created to fulfill that which He is worthy to receive. It is a great privilege to bring glory to God. When we were not in a position to bring God glory, Jesus died to reconcile us unto God as sons and daughters. Through imputed righteousness, we can stand in God's presence before His throne (**Hebrews 4:16**). What an honor!

It is sin that separates us from God, but the finished work of Christ on the cross redeems us. We live in a fallen world characterized by false narratives that seek to rob us of our calling to bring glory to our Father. Sin is being camouflaged and many associated problems that we face in society are given incorrect diagnoses. With an incorrect diagnosis comes incorrect or no solutions. If a doctor examines a patient by listening to an incorrect diagnosis of symptoms, without personal testing, they will likely diagnose the condition incorrectly. An incorrect diagnosis will lead to the wrong treatment. This can be looked at spiritually.



For example, there are those who live together or engage in sexual relations outside the covenant of marriage. This is called consensual sex which is a false narrative with an incorrect diagnosis. The correct diagnosis is to call this act "fornication" which is sin. As sin, it separates us which, ultimately ends in death (James 1:15). Another example of a false narrative is abortion as a "choice" or "health care." This diagnosis is incorrect and may leave one with no concern or regret. The correct diagnosis is to call this murder which is sin. Once sin is identified as the correct diagnosis, then the proper description can be given which is to repent and appropriate the shed blood of Jesus.

How do we determine the correct narrative and diagnosis? The answer is simple, we must use the Word of God as the final authority in ALL matters pertaining to faith and practice. Using the standard of God's Word, we can properly diagnose and take appropriate countermeasures which include asking for forgiveness and realigning our hearts and actions according to God's Word.



1 John 2:1 reminds us, "My little children, these things I write to you, so that you may not sin. And if anyone sins, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous."

As the world runs faster and blindly with false narratives and wrong diagnoses, chaos rises to new heights. Jesus is our hope, and we are called to share this message. The finished work of Christ goes far beyond the single act of coming to faith in Christ; not only are we in right standing with God, but the cleansing power is available throughout our Christian journey so that we might live for His glory...thank you, Jesus!


Lord gave us our bodies and it is our responsibility to care for the bodies He gave us, just as much as we care for our Spirit.

South Atlantic Leadership Training (SALT) UPDATE

Instructors were Pastors Nate Crandall, Carl Greene, Nick Kersten, John Pethtel, Luis Lovelace, Garfield Miller, Jasmine Lynch, & Andrew Samuels, and Sister Janet Thorngate. SALT 2 started February 26, 2023, with 13 of the students who completed SALT 1. For SALT 2 we will have a mix of in-person and ZOOM seminars for the 8 modules.

SALT 1 for 2022 started in January and ended with graduation on November 11, 2022. To God be the glory! Special thank you to the Memorial Board for its confidence in this training program, Brother Don Graffius for being the graduation's keynote speaker, and Pastor Carl Greene for coordinating between the SALT Executive and the Memorial Board. SALT 1 started with 30 students and ended with nineteen students from 7 SAA Churches graduating: 15 with completion certificates and 4 with participation. Students who didn't complete the program gave various reasons, family challenges, demanding jobs, and sickness. They were encouraged to reregister a more suitable time in the future. Based on an evaluation completed by eighteen of the nineteen graduates, the general consensus is that the program was beneficial, their objectives for doing the course were met, and they found the curriculum and material helpful for the course and their ministries.



The modules are: Practical Ministries, OT Survey, Sabbath Theology, Church Administration, Homiletics, Evangelism, Christian Education, and Christian Counseling. The fist seminar was in the Edgewater. Special thanks to Pastor Keith McCall who assisted us finding a venue. The other inperson seminars will be at the Daytona SDB church. We are grateful that the program continues to have the financial support of the Memorial Board. We encourage churches to keep supporting their students and we look forward to another graduation at the next gathering of Association in November 2023.

A TRIP TO NICARAGUA

The West Palm Beach SDB Church is planning a mission's trip to Nicaragua from July 2-12, 2023. The Seventh Day Baptist ministry on Corn Island, Nicaragua is led by Pastor Shirley Morgan and her husband, Fernando Morgan. They have been working to build the Kingdom of God in their part of the vineyard. As they labor in ministry to God's people, they are also in the advanced stages of building a massive worship center. They consistently explain that they depend on God to make things happen that otherwise do not seem possible. They are building His Kingdom by faith!

The team to Nicaragua will be led by Pastor Jasmine Lynch. SDBs, especially in the South Atlantic Association, are welcome to join. The mission will be partnering with Pastor Shirley and the church in Evangelism Outreach: including one-one witnessing, and evangelistic services. It is projected that expenses per person will be about \$800 for airfare, plus hotel accommodation.

FROM SIS JANET'S KITCHEN



RECIPE

2 lbs. fresh green beans
8 oz. chopped onions
2 strips bacon
4 oz. butter
1 teaspoon chopped garlic
1.5 cups chicken broth
1 cup chopped mushrooms
3 tablespoons flour (AP)
1.5 cups evaporated milk
1 cup shredded cheddar
cheese

1 cup onion chips



GREEN BEAN CASSEROLE

Add washed green beans to boiling water for five minutes.

Drain beans and place in ice cold water to stop cooking and set aside.

Place chopped bacon in skillet and cook until slightly browned. Add chopped onions, garlic and mushrooms to skillet and cook until tender. Remove from skillet and set aside.

Melt butter in skillet, then add flour. Stir and cook for 2 minutes then add chicken stock; and cook until thickened. Pour in milk, salt, pepper, and shredded cheese. Remove from stove, then slowly combine cooled, drained green beans to sauce.

Place in casserole dish and top with onion chips. Bake in 350-degree oven for 15 minutes.

It's a delicious side dish. **Turkey bacon can be substituted.
